1. GUIDED TOUR OF FES EL-BALI MEDINA

Dive into the heart of Fes, Morocco’s cultural capital, with a Guided Tour of Fes el-Bali Medina (3-4 hours), exploring the world’s largest car-free urban area and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Founded in 789 CE, this labyrinthine medina is a living museum of Morocco’s history, with over 9,000 alleys brimming with vibrant souks, ancient landmarks, and artisan workshops. Led by expert local guides, this tour unveils the stories of Fes’s founding by Idris I, its role as an imperial city, and its enduring spiritual significance. Perfect for history buffs, culture enthusiasts, and first-time visitors, this immersive experience brings the medina’s magic to life.

What to Expect:

- **Tour Structure:** Meet your guide at Bab Boujloud (the iconic Blue Gate) or a central point like a riad in the medina (e.g., Riad Laaroussa). The 3-4 hour walking tour navigates the medina’s narrow, cobblestone alleys in small groups (6-12 people) for a personalized feel. Guides, fluent in English, French, or Spanish, share historical and cultural insights, pointing out hidden gems and navigating the maze with ease.
- **Key Stops:** Visit Al Quaraouiyine University (world’s oldest, founded 859 CE, exterior only for non-Muslims), the Chouara Tannery with its colorful leather-dyeing pits (viewed from terraces), and Nejjarine Square with its ornate fountain and museum. Explore bustling souks selling carpets, brassware, spices, and ceramics. Some tours include a stop at Bou Inania Madrasa, known for its intricate tilework.

Experience: Expect moderate walking (2-3 km) on uneven streets with occasional steps; comfortable shoes are essential. The medina is vibrant and crowded, with sensory overload from spice aromas, donkey carts, and vendor calls. Tours run morning (8-9 AM) or afternoon (2-3 PM) to avoid midday heat. A brief mint tea break may be included at a local café. The pace is relaxed, with time for photos



and questions, though the medina’s bustle requires staying close to your guide to avoid getting lost.

- **Accessibility:** Not ideal for mobility issues due to uneven terrain and steps. Tours are family-friendly, but young children may tire.

Highlights:

- **Al Quaraouiyine University:** Marvel at the exterior of this 9th-century institution, a global center of learning, with its mosque’s green-tiled minaret visible from the medina.
- **Chouara Tannery:** Witness traditional leather dyeing in vibrant vats, a centuries-old craft, best viewed from shop terraces (entry ~10 MAD).
- **Nejjarine Museum of Wooden Arts:** Explore a restored caravanserai showcasing intricate woodwork and Rif Mountain artifacts (~20 MAD).
- **Souks and Artisan Workshops:** Browse stalls for handmade textiles, pottery, and spices, with opportunities to watch weavers or metalworkers in action.

2. MOROCCAN COOKING CLASS AND STREET FOOD

Immerse yourself in Morocco's rich culinary heritage with a Moroccan Cooking Class with Market Visit in Fes, a 3-5 hour hands-on experience that brings the flavors of the medina to life. Perfect for food lovers, this class takes you from the vibrant souks of Fes el-Bali to a traditional riad or local home, where you'll learn to prepare authentic dishes like tagine, pastilla, or harira under the guidance of a skilled chef. Starting with a market visit to select fresh ingredients, this cultural journey offers a taste of Fes's gastronomic soul, blending cooking with insights into Rif and Moroccan traditions. Ideal for beginners and seasoned cooks alike, you'll enjoy your creations in a warm, authentic setting.

What to Expect:

- **Market Visit:** Begin at a bustling medina market (e.g., R'cif Market or near Bab Boujloud) with your chef or guide, exploring stalls brimming with fresh produce, spices like saffron and cumin, and local specialties like preserved lemons. Learn to identify quality ingredients and haggle like a local in a 30-45 minute guided tour.
- **Cooking Class:** Head to a traditional riad (e.g., Riad Taha, Palais Amani, or a local home) for a 2-3 hour cooking session. 3. DAY TRIP TO VOLUBILIS, MOULAY IDRIS, AND MEKNES

Embark on a captivating Day Trip to Volubilis, Moulay Idriss, and Meknes (8-10 hours), exploring Morocco's rich Roman and imperial heritage from Fes. This guided tour takes you to the UNESCO-listed Roman ruins of Volubilis, the sacred hilltop town of Moulay Idriss Zerhoun, and the imperial city of Meknes, all within a 1-2 hour drive from Fes. Perfect for history buffs and culture seekers, this journey blends ancient archaeology, spiritual significance, and grand architecture, offering a glimpse into Morocco's diverse past. With private or small-group options, you'll enjoy scenic Rif Mountain drives and expert insights from local guides.

What to Expect:

- **Departure and Transport:** Depart Fes (8-8:30 AM) from your hotel or a central point (e.g., Bab Boujloud) in a private 4x4 or air-conditioned minivan (6-12 people). The tour includes round-trip transport, with English, French, or Spanish-speaking guides and drivers. Expect 1-2 hours of driving between sites, with scenic stops in the Rif Mountains.

Visit the grand Bab Mansour gate, the Mausoleum of Moulay Ismail (open to non-Muslims, modest dress required), and the Sahrij Swani basin. Explore the medina's quieter souks for spices or crafts. Lunch at a local restaurant (e.g., Restaurant Salma, ~50-100 MAD, not included) is included in some tours.
- **Return:** Arrive back in Fes by 6-7 PM, totaling 8-10 hours. The pace is relaxed but involves moderate walking (2-3 km) on uneven terrain at Volubilis and cobblestone streets in Meknes. 4. VISIT THE ROYAL PALACE AND FES EL-JDID

DISCOVER THE REGAL AND HISTORIC CHARM OF FES EL-JDID, THE “NEW” 13TH-CENTURY MEDINA, WITH A VISIT TO THE ROYAL PALACE AND FES EL-JDID (2-3 HOURS). THIS GUIDED OR SELF-GUIDED TOUR EXPLORES THE ROYAL PALACE OF FES (DAR EL-MAKHZEN), KNOWN FOR ITS STUNNING BRASS GATES, AND THE ADJACENT MELLAH, FES’S HISTORIC JEWISH QUARTER. UNLIKE THE BUSTLING FES EL-BALI, THIS QUIETER DISTRICT OFFERS A BLEND OF ROYAL GRANDEUR, JEWISH HERITAGE, AND SERENE GARDENS, SUCH AS JARDIN JNAN SBIL. PERFECT FOR HISTORY AND CULTURE ENTHUSIASTS, THIS TOUR PROVIDES A FASCINATING GLIMPSE INTO FES’S IMPERIAL AND MULTICULTURAL PAST, JUST A SHORT WALK FROM THE OLDER MEDINA.

WHAT TO EXPECT:

- **GUIDED TOUR:** MEET YOUR GUIDE AT A CENTRAL POINT, SUCH AS BAB BOUJLOUD OR NEAR FES EL-JDID’S MAIN GATE (BAB DEKKAKIN), FOR A 2-3 HOUR WALKING TOUR IN SMALL GROUPS (6-12 PEOPLE). ENGLISH, FRENCH, OR SPANISH-SPEAKING GUIDES SHARE INSIGHTS INTO THE AREA’S HISTORY, FOUNDED IN 1276 BY THE MARINIDS AND EXPANDED AS A JEWISH QUARTER IN THE 14TH CENTURY. VISIT THE ROYAL PALACE’S EXTERIOR (ENTRY NOT PERMITTED), ADMIRE ITS GOLDEN-BRONZE GATES AND INTRICATE ZELLIGE TILEWORK, AND EXPLORE THE MELLAH’S NARROW STREETS, INCLUDING THE IBN DANAN SYNAGOGUE (ENTRY ~20 MAD). STOP AT JARDIN JNAN SBIL FOR A PEACEFUL BREAK. TOURS MAY INCLUDE A VISIT TO LOCAL SOUKS FOR JEWELRY OR LEATHER.
- **SELF-GUIDED VISIT:** START AT BAB DEKKAKIN OR WALK FROM FES EL-BALI (~10 MINUTES) TO THE ROYAL PALACE’S MAIN SQUARE (PLACE DES ALAOUTTES). VIEW THE PALACE GATES (NO INTERIOR ACCESS) AND WANDER THE MELLAH’S DISTINCTIVE STREETS, NOTING BALCONIED HOUSES UNIQUE TO THE JEWISH QUARTER. VISIT THE IBN DANAN SYNAGOGUE (OPEN 9 AM-5 PM, ~20 MAD) AND THE JEWISH CEMETERY NEARBY. RELAX IN JARDIN JNAN SBIL, A LUSH PUBLIC GARDEN WITH FOUNTAINS AND CITRUS TREES. THE TOUR TAKES 1.5-2 HOURS AT A LEISURELY PACE; MAPS ARE AVAILABLE AT RIADS OR THE TOURIST OFFICE.
- **EXPERIENCE:** EXPECT LIGHT TO MODERATE WALKING (1-2 KM) ON MOSTLY FLAT, COBBLESTONE STREETS, SUITABLE FOR MOST FITNESS LEVELS. THE AREA IS LESS CROWDED THAN FES EL-BALI, OFFERING A CALMER VIBE. MORNING VISITS (9-11 AM) AVOID MIDDAY HEAT; SPRING (MARCH-MAY) AND FALL (SEPTEMBER-NOVEMBER) OFFER MILD WEATHER (60-80°F/15-27°C). THE PALACE AREA HAS SECURITY; PHOTOGRAPHY OF GUARDS IS PROHIBITED. THE MELLAH FEELS LIVED-IN, WITH LOCAL SHOPS AND CAFÉS ADDING CHARM.

- **ROYAL PALACE (DAR EL-MAKHZEN):** ADMIRE THE MASSIVE BRASS GATES AND COLORFUL ZELLIGE TILES OF THIS 80-HECTARE PALACE, A SYMBOL OF MOROCCO’S MONARCHY (EXTERIOR ONLY).
- **MELLAH AND IBN DANAN SYNAGOGUE:** EXPLORE FES’S HISTORIC JEWISH QUARTER, WITH ITS 17TH-CENTURY SYNAGOGUE FEATURING RESTORED WOODWORK AND A MIKVEH (RITUAL BATH).
- **JEWISH CEMETERY:** VISIT THIS SERENE SITE WITH WHITEWASHED TOMBS, OFFERING INSIGHT INTO FES’S JEWISH HERITAGE (~20 MAD).
- **JARDIN JNAN SBIL:** RELAX IN A TRANQUIL 18TH-CENTURY GARDEN WITH FOUNTAINS, PALM TREES, AND VIEWS OF THE MEDINA WALLS, PERFECT FOR A BREAK.

5. TRADITIONAL HAMMAM AND SPA EXPERIENCE

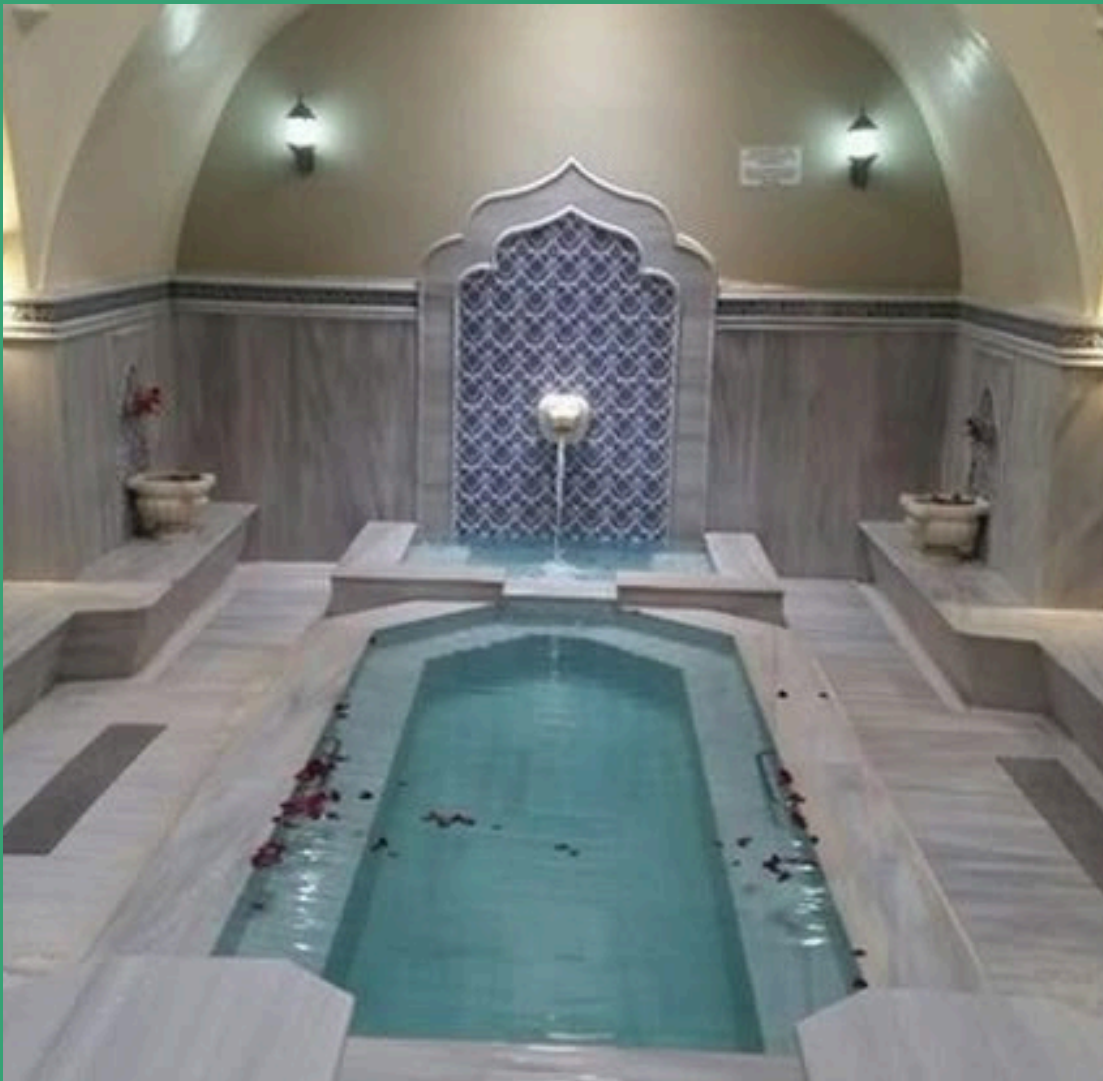
Indulge in a quintessential Moroccan wellness ritual with a Traditional Hammam and Spa Experience in Fes, a 1-2 hour rejuvenating journey that cleanses both body and mind. Rooted in centuries-old traditions, the hammam is a steam bath found in historic riads or modern spas, offering a cultural escape from the bustling medina. This experience, available at venues like Riad Laaroussa or Palais Faraj, includes steaming, exfoliation with Moroccan black soap, and optional argan oil massages. Perfect for travelers seeking relaxation and authenticity, it's a serene highlight of Fes's cultural tapestry, leaving you refreshed and immersed in Moroccan hospitality.

What to Expect:

- **Hammam Session:** Book a private or shared session at a reputable spa or riad. Begin in a warm, tiled steam room (80-100°F/27-38°C) to open pores, followed by an application of savon beldi (black soap) made from olive oil. A same-gender attendant performs a vigorous exfoliation with a kessa glove, removing dead skin, then rinses you with warm water. The process, lasting 45-60 minutes, concludes with a cool-down period, often with mint tea. Private sessions offer more comfort for solo travelers or couples; shared hammams are less common for tourists.
- **Add-Ons:** Enhance your experience with a 30-60 minute massage using argan oil, a Moroccan staple, or a ghassoul clay mask for skin hydration. Some packages include a hair wash or foot scrub. Post-session, relax in a lounge or on a rooftop terrace with views of Fes's medina, sipping tea or juice. Sessions are intimate (1-4 people for private bookings), with English-speaking staff explaining the process for first-timers.
- **Experience:** The hammam's humid, soothing ambiance feels like a step back in time, with intricate zellige tiles and soft lighting. Expect professional, respectful service, with modesty preserved (swimsuits or disposable underwear provided). Sessions run morning to evening (10 AM-8 PM); spring (March-May) and fall (September-November) offer comfortable post-hammam weather (60-80°F/15-27°C). Public hammams exist but are less tourist-friendly; riad-based spas ensure hygiene and ease. Moderate physical effort is involved (sitting/lying on warm surfaces), suitable for most.

Highlights:

- **Authentic Ritual:** Participate in a Moroccan tradition, connecting with locals' daily wellness practices in a historic or luxurious setting.
- **Deep Cleansing:** Enjoy a thorough exfoliation with black soap and kessa glove, leaving skin silky and refreshed.
- **Spa Ambiance:** Relax in beautifully tiled steam rooms, often in restored riads, with calming aromas and serene vibes.
- **Optional Massage:** Unwind with an argan oil massage, soothing muscles after medina explorations, paired with rooftop tea.

6.FROM FES: 3 DAYS AND 2 NIGHTS DESERT TRIP TO MARRAKECH

Embark on an unforgettable 3 Days and 2 Nights Desert Trip from Fes to Marrakech, a journey through Morocco's diverse landscapes, from the Middle Atlas Mountains to the golden Erg Chebbi dunes of the Sahara and the High Atlas. This guided tour, perfect for adventurers and culture enthusiasts, includes camel trekking, a night in a luxury desert camp, and visits to iconic sites like Ait Ben Haddou Kasbah and Todra Gorge. Covering approximately 500-550 km, this private or small-group tour (6-12 people) offers a blend of Berber culture, stunning scenery, and immersive experiences, ending in vibrant Marrakech. Inspired by your interest in Morocco's cultural and scenic gems, this trip delivers an authentic adventure through the heart of the country.

What to Expect:

- Day 1: Fes to Merzouga (Sahara Desert) (~7-8 hours, 460 km)
- Depart Fes at 8 AM from your hotel or riad (e.g., Hotel Batha, Bab Boujloud) in an air-conditioned 4x4 or minivan. Drive through the Middle Atlas Mountains, stopping at Ifrane, Morocco's "Little Switzerland," with its alpine-style architecture, and the Cedar Forest of Azrou to see Barbary macaques. Pause for lunch in Midelt (~50-100 MAD, not included), known for its apple orchards. Continue via the scenic Ziz Valley, with its lush palm groves and dramatic cliffs, to Merzouga. At Erg Chebbi dunes, embark on a 1-2 hour camel trek to a luxury desert camp, watching a magical sunset. Enjoy a traditional Moroccan dinner (tagine or couscous) with Berber music around a campfire under a starry sky. Overnight in a private tent (standard or luxury, with private bathrooms in luxury options).
- Day 2: Merzouga to Dades Valley (~5-6 hours, 250 km)

- Day 3: Dades Valley to Marrakech (~7-8 hours, 320 km)
- After breakfast, explore Dades Gorge for panoramic views. Drive to Ouarzazate, Morocco's "Hollywood," visiting the UNESCO-listed Ait Ben Haddou Kasbah, a fortified village featured in films like Gladiator (optional local guide, ~3 EUR). Stop for lunch (~50-100 MAD, not included) and optionally visit Atlas Studios, the largest film studio in Africa (~80 MAD). Cross the High Atlas Mountains via the Tizi n'Tichka Pass (2,260m), with stops at Berber villages for photos. Arrive in Marrakech by 6-8 PM, with drop-off at your hotel or Jemaa el-Fnaa Square. Expect 5-7 hours of driving daily, with moderate walking (1-2 km) on uneven terrain. June 2025 weather is warm (85-95°F/29-35°C daytime, cooler desert nights ~60°F/15°C).

7. DAY TRIP TO CHEFCHAOUEN

Embark on a captivating Day Trip to Chefchaouen from Fes, exploring Morocco’s enchanting “Blue Pearl” nestled in the Rif Mountains. Just a 4-hour drive each way, this guided tour immerses you in Chefchaouen’s UNESCO-listed blue-washed medina, historic Kasbah, and serene Ras El Maa waterfall. Perfect for travelers seeking a blend of cultural charm, photogenic streets, and a relaxed vibe, this 10-12 hour adventure offers private or small-group options with scenic stops through the Rif’s rolling hills. Inspired by your love for Chefchaouen’s unique allure, this trip showcases its vibrant hues and tranquil atmosphere, a perfect complement to Fes’s bustling energy.

What to Expect:

- **Departure and Transport:** Depart Fes at 8-8:30 AM (June 13, 2025) from your hotel or riad (e.g., near Bab Boujloud) in a private air-conditioned 4x4 or minivan (6-12 people). The 4-hour drive (200 km) through the Rif Mountains includes 1-2 stops for photos or coffee at scenic viewpoints like Ouezzane or along the R412. English, French, or Spanish-speaking guides/drivers provide context about the region’s Berber heritage.
- **Chefchaouen Exploration:** Arrive by noon for 3-4 hours in Chefchaouen. Enjoy a 1-1.5 hour guided tour of the blue medina, visiting Plaza Uta el-Hammam, the heart of the city with its Grand Mosque and lively cafés, and the Kasbah Museum (~20 MAD, optional), a 15th-century fortress with a garden and Rif artifacts. Stroll the azure alleys, perfect for photography, and see Ras El Maa waterfall, a serene local gathering spot. Free time allows for lunch at a local restaurant (e.g., Bab Ssour or Cafe Sofia, ~50-100 MAD, not included) and shopping in souks for textiles, leather, or ceramics. Some tours include a short hike to the Spanish Mosque (20-30 minutes) for panoramic sunset views if timing allows.
- **Return:** Depart Chefchaouen by 4-5 PM, arriving back in Fes by 8-9 PM, totaling 10-12 hours. Expect moderate walking (2-3 km) on cobblestone streets; comfy shoes are essential. June weather in Chefchaouen is warm (80-90°F/27-32°C), with cooler mountain evenings (~65°F/18°C). Tours include transport and a guide; entry fees and lunch are typically extra.

Highlights:

- **Blue Medina:** Wander Chefchaouen’s iconic blue-washed alleys, a UNESCO gem with vibrant doorways and flower pots, ideal for Instagram-worthy photos.
- **Plaza Uta el-Hammam:** Soak in the lively main square, surrounded by cafés and near the historic Grand Mosque.
- **Kasbah Museum:** Explore the 15th-century fortress’s garden and ethnographic exhibits showcasing Rif Mountain culture (~20 MAD).
- **Ras El Maa Waterfall:** Visit this tranquil spring where locals gather, offering a glimpse into daily life.
- **Rif Mountain Scenery:** Enjoy picturesque drives through green hills and olive groves, with stops for panoramic views.
